Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Provincial animal welfare legislation has developed In two main categories:

- General animal protection
 - i.e. general legislation to protect all animals, and provide authority to remove animals from neglectful or abusive situations.
- 2. Regulatory control and licensing

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Provincial approach – commonalities:

- Strict liability offences (versus the Criminal Code where intent must be proved).
- Distress is a common term used in general animal protection legislation, with similar meanings.
- All provincial general animal protection statutes have the ability to take an animal into custody for their protection.

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Ontario approach: General:

 Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act (general powers to issue orders, or remove or euthanize animals in distress).

Standards of Care

Several provinces (and many municipalities where permitted by provincial law) have enacted standards of care, setting out minimum expected standards of care for animals.

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Standards of Care, an example:

Alberta Animal Protection Act

- 2.1 A person who owns or is in charge of an animal (a) must ensure that the animal has adequate food and water,
 - (b) must provide the animal with adequate care when the animal is wounded or ill,
 - (c) must provide the animal with reasonable projection from injurious heat or cold, and a) must provide the animal with adequate
 - (d) must provide the animal with adequate

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Statistics:

- 9 out of 10 provinces have general animal protection legislation protecting livestock Several provinces exempt standard and accepted husbandry practices from being illegal.
- 3 provinces specifically regulate livestock transport.
- 3 provinces specifically regulate welfare of livestock as Falliction, et processing a sequence 200 21,000

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Range of enforcement tools exist across Canada in provincial laws:

- Orders to compel owners/custodians to take action.
- Ticketable offences
- Ability to euthanize animals
- Court orders to prohibit ownership, or establish

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Innovative approaches in other areas,

- Administrative Monetary Penalties Civil Penalties (environmental protection)
- Mandatory reporting (child protection and environmental protection)
- Intelligence collection and analysis, and targeted enforcement.
- Standards of Compliance (Ontario meat plants providing standard interpretation of NFACC's National Farm Animal Care & Welfare Conference, September 20 & 21, 2007

Provincial Approach to Animal Welfare

Codes of Practice

Several pieces of animal protection legislation have by regulation incorporate by reference a requirement to comply with the Recommended Code of Practice for Farm Animals, or set the Code the acceptable standard.

- Should the Codes look more like Canadian Standards Association or Canadian General Standards Board Codes?

Parting thoughts:

- Standards of Care, making owners obligations clear have become more prevalent in Canada, and across Europe and the US States.
- Incorporating Codes of Practice that are clearly written with established standards will assist inspectors in interpreting standards of care.

Experience in ticketable offences in other section should be looked at as a manner to achieve compliance without lengthy court process, where 20 & 21, 2007.
